

Short Message

resulting in difficulty in navigation at sea is expected between Saldanha Bay and Cape Agulhas on Thursday morning, spreading to Alexander Bay and Plettenberg Bay on Friday until Saturday (11-13/05/2023).

Discussion

South-westerly waves with significant wave heights of 4.0 to 5.0 m are expected between Saldanha Bay and Cape Agulhas on Thursday late morning, spreading to Alexander Bay and Plettenberg Bay by Friday morning until Saturday. Together with these waves, south-easterly winds (50-70 km/h gusting 90 km/h) can be expected along the west and the south-west coast on Friday and Saturday. The combination of these conditions will result in chaotic, rough and choppy seas.

Impacts

Difficulty in navigation at sea for small vessels and personal watercrafts (e.g. kayaks) due to quick successive, steep waves is likely. These vessels will also be at risk of taking on water and capsizing in locality. Localised disruptions to small harbours and ports as well as beachfront activities is possible.

Instruction

Small boats and personal water craft are advised to stay away from the open sea and seek the shelter of a harbour, river estuary or protected bay. The public, especially the tourists that are not familiar with the coastal routes where built-up of sand are expected are advised to seek alternatives routes beforehand.

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
